

UBCO 2x2 electric motorbike

The Nelson Lakes DOC team has recently acquired an UBCO 2x2 electric motorbike which you will start to see in action around some of our tracks. This New Zealand designed and built electric motorbike is common enough on farms and has been used by DOC rangers in other places since 2018. It has proven to be great at carrying the likes of chainsaws, fuel, hand tools and trap boxes along rideable tracks and in more open areas such as at Teetotal. DOC staff have used these extensively on the Old Ghost Road Track and the Paparoa Track. Riders need to build their skills before they can extend the UBCO use too far. Riding this, like a lot of ranger work, can be fun but it needs to be done in a considered and considerate manner. We are aware that some may see the UBCO as a hazard to walkers or other bike riders (when on the MTB trails) as they are essentially silent aside from a light electric motor whine. Their speed is very easy to control, right down to a slow walking speed, and the riders will always have high vis and give a quick toot on the horn if they are approaching a blind corner or coming up behind others. Being silent, it will only minimally detract from the experience of those who have come to enjoy the native bird song and general quiet we all love, will help save rangers' backs and won't add to our carbon footprint.



Teetotal Sighting-In Range

There has been a lot of work done to make the Teetotal Sighting-In Range ready to meet the requirements under the new regulations under the Arms Act 1983. This includes a gravelled access road, a fenced and gated range boundary, new terracing and work on and around the bullet catcher target area. We expect to install a small sign kiosk and a red flag to raise when the range is in use this coming week. Thanks to those community volunteers

who helped with some of this work and especially Bill O'Leary. Bill has guided us through this upgrade and also helped with the application to the new Police firearms authority.

If you hold a current permit to use the range it will become invalid later this week on June 30. **From 1st July** (this coming Saturday) every use of the range will be under the supervision of a nominated 'Range Officer' who will need to obtain a **Teetotal Sighting-In Range Permit** in person from the visitor centre and sign up to their responsibilities under the Range Standing Orders. The appointed Range Officer must also be a licenced firearms holder and hold a standard DOC hunting permit. Be sure to bring your fire arms licence and DOC hunting permit to be sighted when you come to obtain a Teetotal Sighting-In Range Permit.

I expect some may ask why you need a DOC hunting permit just for sighting in. This is because the only way we can currently approve the discharge of a firearm on public conservation land is through the hunting permit system of the Conservation Act 1987. It is possible that the range permit (issued under the police managed Arms Act) may be recognised as permission on its own but this hasn't happened yet.

It can't be stated strongly enough how important it is that the rules around the use of the range are respected and fully observed. Individuals who misuse the range will be committing a criminal act. They will have their permits and potentially their firearms licence revoked and will likely face prosecution by the police. If this isn't done well, the range will need to be disestablished with all improvements dismantled. Let's all make this work.

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

A Notice from Marlborough Police Crime Prevention Group. June 21.

There has been a recent theft of a number plate from a trailer in the Wairau Valley township area. The Offender/s have entered onto the property and removed the number plate from a trailer, which at the time was parked near to the main house where the trailer was stored.

Offenders usually steal number plates with the intention of stealing a trailer from another location, at which time they will attach the stolen plate so that the stolen trailer is harder to trace back to its original owner and on the face of it is legitimate. Whilst this latest incident occurred in the Wairau Valley, we would encourage our Marlborough Rural Community to be aware of this type of offending and to report the loss of any number plates immediately.

We will tag the stolen registration plate as stolen so whenever it is encountered we can recover that plate and the trailer it is on.

Consider other ways of protecting your trailer - have the registration number welded onto the frame or a similar identifier that the Police can trace. Also have photos of your trailer for Police and insurance purposes.

If your trailer is parked in an area that is isolated or on the road, chain it with a substantial chain and lock it to something secure.

Just a reminder please also report any suspicious activity you come across.

Basically, if you are asking yourself.... that seems suspicious - "what's that person or vehicle doing there?" Follow your instincts, if something does not seem right it most likely isn't. Let the police know about it.

When reporting even if it's just the "where and when", along with a registration plate number of the vehicle, that maybe enough for us to check out and follow up.

Please phone it through to Police on the 105 line or complete the online reporting form.
