February marks the start of a busy season of events on Lake Rototiti. Firstly, the Lake Rototii Waka Ama Festival on the 9th and 10th February followed by the annual NZ Antique and Classic Boat Show in its 24th year this March. The Rototii Power Boat Club will hold its annual event on Saturday 9th March and Sunday 10th March between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm. Parking at the DOC Visitor Centre for these events is not permitted.

The power boat event attracts a large crowd and noise from the event can travel across the lake and surrounding valleys. Event management will take place at Kerr Bay. Public access remains open, however traffic, carparking and noise levels will be much higher than usual. Recreational walking, boating and beach access can be accessed more readily at West Bay during these busy event weekends.

Fish Passage project work coming to St Arnaud

As part of our Freshwater Improvement Fund work to improve fish diversity and abundance across Tasman, we are pleased to let residents know that the next phase of our Fish Passage Programme is coming to Tophouse/St Arnaud from next week.

The Tasman Jobs for Nature Fish Passage Project is running until June 2026 assessing and carrying out simple structure 'fixes' to make them fish friendly.

This five year project is all about making Tasman waterways passable for our native fish! With the support of landowners across the district, we will enable them to complete their natural life cycles.

Our shift to Tophouse and St Arnaud represents a continuation of our efforts in other parts of the district, with fish in Golden Bay, Moutere, Tapawera and Waimea already enjoying waterways that are easier to navigate.

From a local perspective, our fish passage work follows efforts undertaken to create a natural wetland at the Parker wetland, just a stone's throw from Lake Rotoiti

project is one of the first natural wetlands funded by the Jobs for Nature programme to protect and enhance native wetlands in our district.

However, this is the first time the fish passage assessment/remediation supplier will be working in your area.

One key focus of this project is to support private landowners by assessing any in-stream structures (such as culverts) and completing remediation when required and within the scope of the project funding.

This project is funded by Tasman District Council, the Ministry of Environment with the support of local iwi – in the hope of assessing all structures on private land in the district by June 2026.

If you have an in-stream structure on your land, a team of fish passage experts from Kūmānu Environmental are visiting private land to help connect waterways and will be in touch with landowners in the coming days to see how they can help.

This work is completely free to landowners and is generally simple to carry out.

The team looks at in-stream structures to see if fish can pass through. If they can't, or are unlikely to, they try and 'fix' any issues.

By adding materials that reduce water speed and create surfaces for fish to swim or climb over, we can have a positive impact on the success of fish migration.

What's involved?

- Potential in-stream structures are identified using aerial maps.
- The field team contacts the landowner to explain the project and arrange a site visit.
- The field team assess any structures to see if they meet the scope of the project (i.e. partial/full barrier).
