LAKE SNOW UPDATE

We are monitoring for a lake snow bloom in Rotoiti and Rotoroa monthly over the summer. So far no bloom has been detected, although we know that the invasive diatom responsible for lake snow, Lindavia, is present in both lakes.

Observations of locals are important in helping everyone to understand what is going on, so if you see any white suspensions of murk in the lake, or gather an accumulation of white slime on your fishing gear while trawling for trout, this is likely to be a lake snow bloom. If you see it, please let DOC staff know by contacting the visitor centre.

Over the busy holiday period duty rangers spoke with lots of visitors and gave out many pamphlets with information about lake snow. If you missed out on this and would like a pamphlet to keep (for example, leave it in the bach for visitors to read) please come to the Visitor Centre.

Please remember that this invasive alga is **microscopic** and can be transferred in single drops of water.

Any gear that has been in Rotoiti or Rotoroa is a risk to other lakes – it could spread lake snow.

PLEASE - CHECK CLEAN DRY your water gear

There is real concern about lake snow travelling to to Rotomairewhenua Blue Lake on peoples' gear. We have increased the hut wardening presence at the hut to help protect the lake from this biosecurity risk. Simple actions such as putting a gopro camera in the water if it had been in Lake Rotoroa up to 2 days previous, could move lake snow.

So far, compliance has been excellent.
