Te Wiki ō Te Reo Māori

The week of 14-20 September / Mahuru is Te Wiki ō Te Reo Māori / Māori Language Week.



Local place names

Several local places have dual Māori/English language names.

The Te Reo place names were finally recognised, in 2014, as part of the treaty settlement for three Te Tau Ihu (northern South Island) iwi: Ngāti Apa ki te Rā Tō, Ngāti Kuia, and Rangitāne o Wairau.
