NZAF delivers - again and again

The staff of DOC Nelson Lakes are very grateful to the Royal New Zealand Air Force's No 3 Squadron for their generous air support for our operational activities during the last week.

Paul Dulieu and an avalanche expert flew deep into the national park to undertake assessments of the current avalanche risk on Tuesday.

On Wednesday, the powerful NH90 flew eight tonnes of firewood into the serviced huts on the Travers-Sabine circuit: Blue Lake, John Tait, Upper Travers, Lakehead, Speargrass and Bushline, plus two loads into Angelus. The flying was very precise so the bags of wood could be placed near the wood sheds. The downdraft from these aircraft is really hard to describe.

Building materials were dropped off at Lakehead Hut and Angelus on Thursday. In addition, staff did a thorough recce of the tracks in the southern Kahurangi and improved track marking in the Matakitaki valley.

No 3 Squadron were based at Dip Flat for a two week training exercise.

DOC Nelson Lakes and New Zealand Defence have built a great working relationship over the years. Senior Ranger Phil Crawford said "Nelson Lakes staff relish the opportunity to work with colleagues in the New Zealand Defence Force. It's pure win/win. DOC gets hard flying tasks completed and the Forces develop their capability in challenging conditions. Ultimately, the activities benefit New Zealanders."



Tasman District Council is working on a project to enable our Tasman Bay/Te Tai o Agrere and Golden Bay/Mohua communities to work towards a plan for how we can best respond to sea level rise and coastal hazards. The impacts of climate change affect us all, and in Tasman we continue to experience the effects of significant weather and storm events. As a Council, we are looking to better prepare our communities for the effects of ongoing changes to weather patterns and rising sea levels. This conversation is occurring in coastal communities all around New Zealand.

Sea level rise and coastal hazards mapping

We've developed a coastal hazards map viewer which maps the extent of low-lying coastal land in Tasman and Golden Bays that may be affected by sea level rise. The viewer shows a range of sea level rise scenarios and coastal hazards including the effects of higher tides caused by storms, and coastal erosion.

An ongoing discussion, we're currently looking for feedback

In this early stage, the focus of the discussion is on raising awareness of sea level rise and coastal hazards, developing a common understanding of the information, and gathering feedback. There are many ways to get involved including answering our short survey, sharing observations of coastal hazards, or providing any comments on the map viewer.

Our coastline is important to everyone. As well as potential impacts on coastal communities, rising sea levels will have increasing implications for other everyday life activities including coastal road access, use of our coastal recreation reserves, activities and experiences in the coastal environment, loss of sacred sites and biodiversity.

Feedback is open until 13 September 2019.

Community drop in sessions in early August

We're holding community drop-in sessions in our coastal communities to enable people to have a look at the coastal hazards maps and find out how to provide feedback. A leading NZ coastal scientist, Dr Rob Bell (NIWA), will be attending these sessions to answer questions, alongside Council staff with local knowledge and expertise. These are informal sessions so feel free to drop in any time between 3.30pm and 6pm.
