
#### NELSON CENTRE OF MUSICAL ARTS

#### Rotoiti kaka update

The kaka here at Nelson Lakes are breeding this season, with the two radio-tagged kaka nesting 2-3 weeks earlier than expected. This is due to the heavy beech mast (flowering/seeding) we are experiencing, kaka in beech forests usually will only breed during a beech mast event.

Four young chicks from one of the nests were removed to be hand raised and released into the Abel Tasman as part of Project Janszoon. This is for the wider benefit for kaka in the top of the South Island. It is expected that the female will re-nest and produce another four chicks, by removing the chicks at a young age it can maximise the production from a pair that instead of only producing four chicks can produce up to eight for the season.

Project Janszoon will be funding transmitters to fit to the chicks in the other radio-tagged female's nest. This will give us information on the dispersal of juvenile kaka and whether they are staying within our stoat trap network.

Meanwhile the bio team are climbing trees and are checking known kaka nest sites to get a better understanding of the survival of chicks and the nesting females who are vulnerable to stoat predation while still inside the nest cavity.

I have been in to St. Arnaud and met a few of you and I look forward to getting to know the community more in the future.

If you see me around don't be shy, come and say hi.

With summer now upon us there are a few messages I would like to get out there:

As people pour in to enjoy this beautiful part of the country, please be aware of your own security with your property.

Keep valuables out of sight in vehicles and that could be visible from the street.

To all you firearm owners please ensure you are storing firearms and ammunition securely and separate, the last thing we want is these tools falling into the sticky hands of criminals.

Hunting and sport shooting will also pick up throughout the summer with extra visitors to the area. Please remember and remind others, that St. Arnaud is busier than the old days and the use of firearms in this built up area is prohibited. If people are considerate of other residents this shouldn't be a problem. This has been voiced as an area of concern by the community and Police take any inappropriate use of firearms seriously.

Lastly, we all know that there will be those road users who may hold up traffic, causing delays and frustration. Expect this to be the case and try to be extra patient

to avoid the dangers of unsafe passing manoeuvres.
