



Avalanche Search and Rescue Training

Avalanches affecting people in NZ are more common than most people would think. Mostly they occur in remote areas where the trapped individuals are only partially buried and are rescued by members of their own party. Until the widespread use of PLBs (personal locator beacons), for avalanches off ski fields, a live rescue of a buried avalanche victim was very unlikely if they could not be rescued by a member of their own team as the chance of a live rescue diminishes rapidly after 35mins of burial. This is still by far the best chance of rescue but with PLBs there is now a realistic chance of having other rescuers on site well within the first hour. The full party wearing avalanche transceivers also massively increases the chances of being found.

There is a lot to learn about avalanches from the patterns of weather which could lead to them, the different types and how they run through to the ongoing risks for rescuers and the most efficient search techniques. Having found people, then it is about how to dig them out as quickly as possible and attend to their medical needs if still alive.

On August 8th and 9th a large scale avalanche rescue exercise was held at Rotoiti Lodge and on Rainbow Ski Field. This saw around 50 personnel from the Police SAR (search and rescue), LandSAR volunteers, Rainbow ski patrol and DOC brushing up on theory on the first day and then a very real exercise on the second day. The Rainbow Ski Patrol are well kitted-out and through the ski season regularly practice avalanche search techniques and rescue. They would expect to be the first team brought into an avalanche rescue either on the edge of the field or anywhere else in the national park. The second team expected on site is likely to a team of trained DOC rangers with police and LandSAR volunteers to follow. Outside the ski season DOC could well be first on scene. Like many larger

scale emergency events it could be years between them, and it takes a disciplined approach to training and equipping a team to ensure that they keep their skills fresh and maintain a readiness to respond. We had 5 on the SAREX, which is a helicopter-full, but we look to maintain a crew of 10 to give us a chance of responding with 5 whenever required. If you see a crew of us who seem to be walking rapidly in random patterns and probing the beach gravels at Kerr Bay, we could well be trying to find an avalanche transceiver equipped dummy!

If you are a winter adventurer, it is vital that you take heed of the avalanche risks through <u>Nelson</u> <u>Lakes | New Zealand Avalanche Advisory</u> on <u>Avalanche.Net.nz</u>. Always wear a transceiver if you are going into potential avalanche terrain and carry a foldable shovel and probe. There are endless clips on Youtube of avalanches and rescues if you want to know a bit more about them. Here is a






