

Rotoiti District Community Council thoughts....

The RDCC was formed in the late 1990s by a core of locals determined to protect our community interests and the local environment .

The perception of many at that time (including central and local government) was that nobody lived here fulltime so they could proceed with any plans without consultation. Over the past 25 years a small but vociferous local population has proved otherwise.

Our local councillor of many years ,Stuart Bryant, (and more recently Christeen Mc Kenzie as well) have given continuous support and relayed our requests back to the TDC for action ,keeping us informed of relevant change. Stuart and/or Christeen give the meetings an update of what's been happening in the district with a focus on our area. They let us know what's coming up that relates to our district.

John Wotherspoon presents a report of DOC's activities and projected work in the National Park and elsewhere. As an incorporated society the RDCC has played a vital role in obtaining grants and donations for local projects as well as enabling other community groups to apply for funding.

Organisations need to move with the times and adapt to the changing needs of their community. This requires input from new people with new ideas to take our community forward in the direction the community chooses, and not have changes forced upon us.

Brian, Wattie and I have been Secretary, Treasurer, and Chairman for the last term and then some. We all have a lot of other community work to do, and figure its time for any one of a number of competent locals to take over, as we will all be standing down this AGM.

We will assist new office holders to settle into their roles. There is an operational grant that offers \$600 for each of the above positions per annum. There are normally six bimonthly meetings per year.

Under our stewardship we have widened the sphere of RDCC's role as the following list of achievements indicate:

- Establishment or the Rotoiti Firesmart Working Group with the assistance of DOC. This has enabled the Greenbreak to be developed in the National Park
- in Lodge Rd and a lot of Firesmart work and education in the village. Ongoing!

- Setting up a Sports Committee to enable community groups to apply for funding. This was Wattie's initiative and has enabled the refurbishment of the Tennis Courts and boats and equipment for the Sailing School, so far.
- Organisation and help with setting up security cameras in the village. Brian headed a small team to fund raise and help implement the system which is working well.
- Making best use of the Kerr Bay Douglas Fir once TDC decided it should come down. John Gully and others sold firewood, and slabs will be sold when drier.All proceeds to Rotoiti School projects.
- The Dark Sky initiative was hard work for Debbie Christie as the goal posts moved. The community was all for this, so we have decided to form our own Rotoiti Dark Sky with voluntary compliance. More to come on this!
- And there was all the usual roads, speed limits, culverts, trees etc.

RDCC is a very useful and valuable organisation that works for our district. It's time for some others in the community to take a turn!

Rotoiti Dark Sky

Several years ago the RDCC canvassed the community as to whether you wanted to go for International Dark Sky status. Everyone who replied was in favour.

Debbie Christie took on the role of co-ordinating with the local Dark Sky expert.

Unfortunately the goal posts kept being moved out until they expected us to co-ordinate a "Top of the South Dark Sky" involving four councils. This was a huge ask. We realised that we are not the ones with the light pollution problem. They are. So we decided to set up our own voluntary Rotoiti Dark Sky with a simple set of easily achieved conditions.

These conditions are those used by many councils and Dark Sky areas in NZ to promote the Dark Sky. Being voluntary they are encouraged, not enforced. So, when the rest of the Top of the South get their act together, they can join our Rotoiti Dark Sky!

Why a Dark Sky?

From a human perspective a dark sky for proper sleep patterns is vital.

Disrupted circadian rhythms cause a number of health issues.

A dark sky is essential for many nocturnal animals' health and life cycles (and diurnal/daytime animals).

The world has only been lit up at night with the advent of electricity, and we are finding more and more downsides to light pollution, which increases considerably each year.

Targeted Light

A Dark Sky does not mean you won't be able to see where you go at night.

Often the lighting is better and safer as it lights only the areas you need to see, and doesn't shine up and disrupt your natural night vision. This applies to driving and walking.

On the home front, outside lights need only shine down on the target area for the length of time you are there. So sensor lights on short timers are ideal, with a shielded downward facing light spread.

Colour of the light is important too. Warm yellow light is the least harmful through the brighter whites to the cool blue/white light as the most harmful. So when you build or need to change bulbs or fittings, choose those with good shielding and the lowest Kelvin(K) value.

Fortunately the warm yellow/white bulbs use the least electricity, and the blue the most, so a Dark Sky can lead to significant power savings over time.

Above all, our night sky is a thing of great clarity and beauty and we need to keep it that way and enhance it! The Rotoiti Dark Sky voluntary code will be available shortly. If you want a dark sky, encourage others to adopt the code too!
