The pool will be open from Monday 7 November.


Cost \$50 for the season

Partial beech mast this year



You might have noticed that some of our native beech trees are flowering right now. They don't do this every year – just in response to a set of climatic cues that sees them flower and seed every few years, and this is called a "mast". Kākā breeding is tied to beech masting, so we will be watching to see if kākā get up to that this year. Later on in autumn, if these flowers hold and progress to seed, there is a massive energy input to the forest ecosystem when the seed falls. We've noticed mountain beech and some red beech flowering at lake level so far, no silver beech though - so it looks like it might be a partial mast. There's a lot on the DOC website about forest seeding patterns, how it's measured, and the implications for introduced predator /native prey interactions here.

Kea are busy raising chicks in holes in the ground right now, so it's a vulnerable time for them. Our trapping networks make a life-or-death difference to the young birds and the adult on the nest. Here is a recent picture from outside one of the nests — Dadda kea feeds Mama kea outside their cosy nest cavity, while babies are hopefully safe and sound and up to all sorts of mischief inside.

Heavy vehicles prohibited from Korere-Tophouse Road

Damage to road surfaces has forced Tasman District Council to bring in controls on heavy vehicles using the Korere-Tophouse Road.

The considerable number of heavy vehicles using the road as an alternative route, while State Highway 6 over the Whangamoa Saddle between Nelson and Blenheim is closed, is causing significant damage to the road pavement at a rate faster than repair crews can fix it.

This damage is ongoing and rapidly worsening, which is creating hazardous conditions for road users.

To ensure the safety of all users, the Tasman District Council is prohibiting heavy vehicles from using Korere-Tophouse Road as a through route.

Traffic travelling between Nelson and Blenheim should use State Highway 6 and State Highway 63 via Kawatiri Junction which is just 18 minutes or 23.8km longer than using Korere-Tophouse Road

Heavy vehicles may use Korere-Tophouse Road to access properties **only where there is no alternative and if this is the origin or destination for a specific trip,** and may be required to provide evidence of this if stopped by police.

For example, carting logs out of a forest accessed from Korere-Tophouse Road, or taking machinery and construction equipment to a worksite along this road, are valid reasons for a truck to be using it.

Notice of Prohibition of Heavy Vehicles – Korere-Tophouse Road

The Tasman District Council, in accordance with Section 10 of the Heavy Motor Vehicle Regulations 1974, hereby prohibit heavy vehicles from using Korere-Tophouse Road as a through route as follows:

- Location Korere-Tophouse Road, from SH6 to SH63
- Axle limit 2,500kg except for local access

Date – from 11 November 2022, until 20
 December 2022, unless revoked sooner

Heavy Vehicles travelling between Nelson and Blenheim must not use Korere-Tophouse Road as a through road.

Give yourselves a Break!

November 2022

Summer is coming, apparently. No-one seems confident to predict the summer weather! Warm and not too dry like the last few, or does the law of averages give us a long hot dry summer? You will have noticed how fast the ground dries out with higher temperatures. You have a month to six weeks to do a clear up at your place to prepare you better for the fire season.

- Clear your gutters; reduces possibility of embers dropping into them and starting a roof fire. Check that all roof downpipes to the tanks are clear and working so you go into summer with maximum water.
- 2. Keep your grass cut short and watered if possible.
- Remove any dead vegetation from around your section, and remove the lower branches of the taller trees to stop fires climbing into the canopy. Make sure vegetation is kept well clear of all buildings.
- 4. If you want a Firetruck to come to your place, make sure you have a four metre wide access way and no overhead branches.
- 5. Store your firewood well away from the house and don't store wood, flammable items or firewood under it.
- 6. Check your smoke alarm works; that you have a good metal ash can with lid; that the Evacuation Plan is prominently displayed. Many baches and houses are rented out so it is vital that visitors know what to do in an emergency.

So, get stuck in! If you need help or advice, talk to Robbie Thomson 021 2950305, or Brian Erasmus 027 384 4464. We can advise on more advanced stages of fire protection and help with chipping branches (for a modest fee). As New Zealand is catching up in the Fire Risk Reduction culture, there will be people who have overseas experience which could prove valuable to us. Please share this with us, we are all learning on the job! There will be two more weekends of working on the Greenbreak this year; November 19th and 20th and December 10th and 11th. These work parties are from 9am to 12 in Lodge Road, and there is work for everyone! Good Footwear and gloves, sunhat etc. See you there.


