We farewell Fraser, Noah and Lachie Hart at the end of the term as they go back to Wellington. It has been a pleasure having the family with us for the term and we are sorry that the skiing wasn't as good as we had hoped.

At the beginning of Term 4 we welcome Rico and Kingston to the Junior Room as the beginning of a small influx over the next 12 months.

Keep encouraging businesses and friends to come to St Arnaud and become a part of our community. We need a significant roll growth to keep two teachers at the school. A minimum of 26 children are required, and I anticipate opening next year with only 17. In 2023 the Board will be funding one teacher.

With any sort of luck, the foundations for the Pool changing sheds will be going down in the holiday period. Many thanks to Ken, Simon, Paul, Barry, and Fred for getting this process underway. At some point we may be calling for volunteers to swing a hammer and wield a paint brush.

Nelson Lakes National Park serviced huts on the Travers Sabine circuit are now in summer pricing. From 1st October – 30th April, nightly hut ticket fees are \$20 per adult/ \$10 per youth per night with the backcountry hut pass not valid during this period.

Standard huts remain \$5 per person per night and backcountry hut pass is valid.

Hut tickets are able to be purchase from the Rotoiti/Nelson Lakes Visitor Centre.

Angelus Hut and Bushline Hut are required to be booked all year round. Angelus Hut is \$30 per person per night (backcountry hut pass not valid) from 1<sup>st</sup> October – 30<sup>th</sup> April.

Bushline Hut is \$15 per person per night/youth \$7.50.



#### Dear Friends,

As some of you may be aware, the historic Rainbow Road signage has been given a bit of a facelift. I bumped into an MDC road team a while ago, and they were replacing signage. It appeared the plan was to 'update' (read 'remove') the old NZED signs. That seemed a bit of a pity, so I collected as many as were left!! and with a good deal on paint from Guthrie Bowron in Nelson, cleaned them up, repainted, and replaced them. They are back. Some of them have 'character'!



The plan to fill the gaps is developing. Peter Phillips, and the team at Tapawera Men's Shed are hoping to be able to rout new signs. I'm sure anyone with routing skills or experience would be welcome to contribute. We need about a dozen new signs to get consistent historic signage to the Molesworth gate.

#### But I need help!

The timber signs are classic. Each is 200x50x1500 (+/-) I reckon short ones (Hells Gate, Judges Creek) would go about 1200, and longer ones (No Catchem Stream) maybe 1600 or so.

If you have any planks lying unguarded behind the woodshed, or at the back of your garage, I would love to use them for this admirable job!! The state of the plank is not crucial, as history dictates these are pretty old signs, dating from when the pylon route was developed through the Rainbow Valley. Old age, cattle, and weather, have all added 'character'...

The second request is some local knowledge!

Is 'No Name Creek' supposed to be No Catch Em Stream?

The two concrete bridges over the Wairau, at the Rainbow confluence, and up above Hell's Gate (Hare Creek?) where the big slips have occurred: did they have specific local names?

Some of the signs will be mounted on trees, as was the style back then, but a few will need to go on posts. Posts (100x100x2400 +/-) of any condition are welcome. I reckon about half a dozen should do the trick.



Rumour has it that some of the old signs may have been souvenired. They are welcome back any time!

There is considerable time pressure !! on this project: finish date Christmas... just haven't decided which Christmas!!

If you have a spare post, plank or two, they can be dropped beside my woodpile, or I can collect them.

There are no rewards for joining this project, other than making a contribution, and feeling good about it.
