### MID SUMMER REMINDER

for

Trampers - kayakers - sailors - waterskiers - fishers -

The microscopic invasive alga that causes lake snow, Lindavia, is present in Lakes Rotoiti and Rotoroa. We are trying hard to make sure all lake users are aware of this, with the purpose of limiting the spread away from the park to other lakes, and preventing the spread into the park, and the pristine backcountry tarns and lakes.

The primary and riskiest vector of freshwater pests is people and their activities.

Any gear that has been in contact with the lake water needs to be fully dry for 48hours, and if that's not possible then soaked in a 10% detergent solution for 10 minutes, to kill the microscopic cells that can transmit the invasive alga to a new place. So we all need to be thinking about tramping boots, gaiters, walking poles, drink bottles, swimming togs, go pro cameras, fishing lines and nets, boats, trailers, waterski-ing equip, wetsuits... ETC! Where has it been? Where is it going next?

There's also always the threat of the next problem freshwater invasive that we don't know about yet. We've been doing our best to ensure that all visitors hear the Check Clean Dry message – this includes people here to enjoy the aquatic wonderland that is the lake, as well as people heading far into the backcountry. The water sport and other events held on conservation land have conditions written into permits that require the organisers to ensure all participants CHECK CLEAN DRY all their gear before and after the event.

We now have a snazzy brochure that is particularly about the Nelson Lakes situation, so if you'd like a copy of that for your home or bach please call in to the visitor centre.

#### **Nelson Lakes National Park Ungulate Control**

DOC is seeking to improve the control of deer, chamois, goats and pigs in the southernmost areas of Nelson Lakes National Park, through increased recreational hunter effort. Following a trial last year which went well, a number of hunting blocks will be opened over the roar, enabling hunting parties to access blocks by approved helicopter operators. Blocks will be allocated on first-come first served basis after 16<sup>th</sup> January, when applications for access opens.

# Native Tree subsidy \$1.50/tree for 100,000 trees in Nelson Tasman

To put in an application for trees available from May 2023 use this Link.


Applications close 30 January.

This year is an experiment and potentially we could run a couple more years if it is fully subscribed so please let others know.

- Do you want to plant native trees on your property? Help the planet, improve water quality, complete some FEP actions, look after the birds, create wetlands, stop erosion, sequester carbon, mitigate methane?
- Would a \$1.50/tree subsidy help you to plant more trees? It is approximately half the price of a root trainer.
- NZ Landcare Trust has received overseas funding from One Tree Planted to provide a \$1.50/tree subsidy for 100,000 trees (>2 m) for projects and landowners living in Nelson/Tasman.
- It will be paid on your behalf directly to the nursery.
- Funding has come from One Tree Planted, a Canadian company, interested in fostering more tree planting around the world.
- They want to work with NZ Landcare Trust and Nelson/Tasman was selected to trial this concept.
- It fits in well with the Tasman new biodiversity strategy where it recognises that landowners should be supported to look after biodiversity.
- We will provide you with a native mix suitable for planting in the open for your site conditions.
- Plants will be available from May 2023, and you are asked to have them planted by September 2023.
- You will be required to provide a map, to NZ Landcare Trust, of where the plants are planted within 1 month of completing planting.
- This map may be shared with the funder. You will also be asked to provide a photo of your planting and provide survival data 1 year and 3 years after planting. Please try to achieve >80% survival.

- We hope to have a successful planting this year and extend this funding for an additional 2 years in Nelson/Tasman and extend to other regions.
- We may ask to visit a few planting sites to photograph or take drone footage for marketing purpose for OTP.


