

Skiing has finally started as well, with the children getting two awesome days on the slopes so far.



Last Thursday we went to the Suter Art gallery to look at their light and geometry installation. Some of them were eye bending. The children then went into the classroom and created their own geometrical/light display Art works.





We also had the New Zealand Defence Force visit us as a part of their recent exercises. They spent some time in the classroom answering questions about what they do and why they come to St Arnaud. After this they provided some PE activities followed by a game of football: 5 soldiers vs all the children and using two soccer balls.

It was a fantastic day, which showcased the NZDF is a great light and gave some of the older children an insight into the varied jobs in the Armed Services.

Road Safety reminder:

When the school bus is stopped to embark or disembark children, the speed limit on both sides of the road is 20kph. We have recently had several vehicles go past the stopped bus at open road speeds, which places our children and drivers at risk. Most of these vehicles have skis on their roofs, which suggests they are not locals. If you know someone who drives to Rainbow from Nelson, could you please remind them of the school bus rules.

Our buses stop in areas of high visibility and the signs on them are very clear.

The logging truck drivers are very good at following this speed rule, which means that it shouldn't be too hard for a private car to do it too.

Happy 54th Conservation Week! Conservation Week has just ended, with a theme of Take Action for Nature. We have a whole lot of taking action for nature going on around our village this week and every week. Ranger Yolanda Shergold spent some time with the senior class at Lake Rotoiti School helping to set up some A24 self resetting rat traps this week. She's also been teaching the class about all the other types of trap that we use, and they have been looking at ways they can help the kea protection programme. More about that at a later date! Here's some handy suggestions for ways you can take action for nature.

1. Picking up rubbish from our natural spaces

Many people love getting outdoors and enjoying the natural spaces around them. Removing rubbish from these spaces is a simple and easy way to get involved in conservation. Removing a little on your morning dog walk or removing a lot in a planned clean-up with a group – it all counts and it all helps restore our natural spaces!

2. Joining a community Predator Free group

Getting on board the Predator Free 2050 movement is a fantastic way to make a lasting impact on the plants and wildlife that live in your community. And you don't have to do that actual trapping to be involved – there are plenty of less hands-on ways for people to contribute. We know these groups are more successful the more people who support them so we want to drive awareness of the important mahi they do.

3. Donate a trap to a community group




We will not accept paid or unpaid advertisements for candidates or political parties other than as described above. The editors will have the final decision on what is published within the guidance provided in this notice.


