There have been a few kereru spotted around the village recently. Last week one crashed into the big window at Blenchynden Shelter (the Kerr Bay campground kitchen). Unfortunately it died, probably reducing the population by a third. We've also heard of at least one other kereru dying this spring after hitting a window.

We are installing low tack UV bird decals to try to help prevent further death at this window – better late than never, maybe.

There's a bit of controversy around how effective window decals are at preventing birds hitting windows – we'd like to hear of your experiences if you've been using these locally.

And if you'd like to try, the <u>bird rescue website</u> is one place to get them.
