Lake Rotoiti School News

The past two weeks at school were packed full of adventure and fun. The Department of Conservation rangers took us around to explore our own backyard and learn about local wildlife.

We visited a wetland area not far from the school to learn about the insects and birds that live there, and to figure out who can get their gumboots stuck the deepest. After the wetland visit, we went to the information centre before heading down to the lake to listen to different birdsong.

A few days later we took a few 4 wheel drives up a steep track to Beeby's Hut, which was adopted by the school last year. There the children did some cleaning and maintenance in and around the hut, including windows, toilet, and mattresses. After a hearty lunch of sausages and bread, we went for a short walk to look at the different plants up there, before splitting up and doing a 5-minute bird count in different areas around the hut.

But that wasn't all we got up to, we also had some fun with the guides from the Outdoor Education Centre. On Wednesday we were supposed to go paddleboarding and kayaking, but the wind changed that plan. Instead we had some fun with different team building activities at the lakefront.

Downer and the Tasman Alliance advises that a network-wide crack-seal programme is starting in March. There is a programmed area of 20,000m2 of sealed roads to be treated.

Crack sealing is a low cost, short term proactive treatment to assist with maintaining the waterproof layer that protects the road structure.

The plant used is new technology that includes both sprayer and chip truck into one vehicle called a chipper sprayer. It is a true mobile operation meaning it doesn't stop - the chipper sprayer travels in a convoy with pilot vehicles, roller, and sweeper, allowing for minimal disruption to the traveling public and rate payers.





The Lake Rotoiti school commenced the first adopt a hut project in partnership with the Department of Conservation Rotoiti/Nelson Lakes.

Last week twelve students, teachers and parents visited the six-bed Beebys Hut in Mt Richmond Forest Park, undertaking general maintenance.

The adopt a hut project is a great practical way for the students to get involved in heritage and conservation within the region. It also gives students stewardship of the hut and fosters a sense of ownership amongst the children and their families.

The students also were involved with citizen science undertaking 5-minute bird counts (5MBC). After lunch the search was on for mountain daisy, gentian, green tussock, carpet grass, mountain snowberry and speargrass common in the area. The hunt for gorse and broom on the Beebys Road proved successful. The weed busting students pulled out some of these along the return trip down the mountain. These activities provide a hands-on education component to their project learning about different birds and plants in the region.

Also last week before a visit to the visitor centre, students learnt about the importance of wetlands at a guided walk and talk. Ranger Ricki explained the environmental benefits of our wetlands such as water quality, flood control and wildlife habitat. The students were intrigued by the diversity of bugs and plants discovering beetle larvae, tadpoles, crickets and spiders.

These field trips are a meaningful and fun way to connect our future rangers and conservationists to nature.
