Tangi a te ngahere, kei te tangi mātou hoki We are very sad to report that one of the two roroa / great spotted kiwi translocated here in May, the female roroa Mahara, has died. In early August we became aware that Mahara was not in her normal location. Since being translocated to Lake Rotoiti in May both new kiwi have settled quickly into their territories, so when Mahara wasn't in her usual spot the team (DOC and Friends of Rotoiti volunteers) put in extra time to find her. It soon became clear that the signal from the transmitter was coming from within the lake. Once this was determined we then worked to find a way of getting to the transmitter. This was delayed longer than we would have liked due to the recent heavy rain and flooding events. On the 30th of August contract divers came to Lake Rotoiti to search for the transmitter. We had identified the likely location and depth of approximately 15 metres for them to search. The divers found Mahara in the lake. We checked her over for injuries and she seemed fine with no evidence of predation. she was also in good condition when she died. This leads us to believe that she had a natural mishap, probably while trying to cross a rain swollen side-stream, and drowned. It is not the first time we have had roroa drown at Rotoiti.

The male roroa, Nga Ararau, is still near where he was released and is showing normal activity levels for this time of the year.

Conservation week

Taking action not only benefits nature, but also our personal wellbeing. Ka ora te whenua, ka ora te tangata – when the land is well, the people are well. When Papatūānuku thrives, we thrive.

At Rotoiti we are lucky to live right in the middle of a very natural and native set of ecosystems, and there is heaps that you can do to help. If you'd like to volunteer locally and give back to the nature all around you, we recommend the marvellous Friends of Rotoiti.

And if you feel inclined to follow the Conservation Week suggestion of donating to nature, the <u>Friends of Rotoiti</u>, or <u>Kea Conservation Trust</u>, are both very active and boots-on-the-ground locally.
