Nelson Green gecko sightings

DOC staff are very excited to hear of several Nelson green gecko (*Naultinus stellatus*) sightings in the last few months.

The Nelson green gecko is found only in the Nelson area from south of the Bryant Range, westwards of the main divide, to the Murchison district and north Westland.

Babies are born alive as opposed to hatching from an egg as many reptiles do. Young (usually twins) are born in the autumn or early winter. Keep an eye out for them.

Nelson green geckos are classified as nationally vulnerable, and although you are not allowed to touch them you can try to spot them on your walks. They live in open scrubland such as manuka and kanuka forests.

One local resident took these photos of one sunning itself in their vegetable patch.
