



TDC engagement on Land and Freshwater Plan

What do you want freshwater in the Tasman region to look like?

Tasman District Council is working on the development of a Land and Freshwater plan, and they want your help to get it right.

The have already defined the Freshwater Management Units, the smaller areas the region will be broken down into under the new plan and set draft Visions and Values for each FMU. Now they need to define the Environmental Outcomes for each of those values.

The draft Environmental Outcomes will set the direction for the new plan change and will be used to set the targets and limits for land and freshwater use in the region, and the rules that they need to achieve them. As the Outcomes define the end goal, it's important they get them right, and that they reflect what the people of Tasman want the region's land and freshwater to look like in the future.

At each stage of the process, they have been engaging with the public to make sure that people agree with what they are doing. They also recognise that any changes to land and freshwater use will mean changes for people working in the rural and environmental sectors, so really want to hear from those people.

The engagement on the Environmental Outcomes stage 3 opens on 20 October and closes 30 November 2023. You can find out more, and have your say at:

Upper Wairau Rainbow Possum Control Notice

Downer New Zealand wishes to advise that a groundbased possum control operation will be taking place to keep possum numbers under control to prevent spread of TB. This operation will be conducted as part of the TBfree New Zealand programme.

Areas covered: The operation covers 11,551 hectares along the Rainbow Road from the Chinaman Stream to No Mans Creek. The operation also extends up to the headwaters of a number of the larger tributaries leading from the valley floor.

Operation date: 1 November 2023 to 30 November 2024.

Poisoning methods: Feratox is a small capsule containing cyanide poison (about the size of a pea). In bait stations the cyanide capsules are placed into a green non-toxic peanut paste contained within a plastic bait station attached to trees and fence posts in suitable habitat.

Traps will also be used throughout the area in conjunction with poisoning methods. The public is warned to take care in these areas and not to remove carcasses or baits. Baits are dangerous to people and dogs.

General warning

- Baits are toxic to people and animals.
- Do not touch poison bait.
- Do not touch traps.
- Poison bait or carcasses are deadly to dogs.
- · Watch children at all times.
- Tell any visitors to the area of the danger.
- Follow the advice on the poison warning signs.

If you suspect poisoning

- Contact your local hospital, or dial 111
- National Poisons Centre 0800 POISON 0800 764 766
- In the case of a domestic animal being poisoned, contact a local veterinarian
