

From Monday 5<sup>th</sup> October to Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> October, Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency will close a section of State Highway 6, between Lamb Valley Road and Kawatiri Junction to undertake storm damage repairs, in particular culvert and guardrail replacements, and inlet structure repairs. Alongside this, we will also be completing road shoulder widening, minor works at the Kawatiri Rest area, and road maintenance activities such as pavement repairs, water channel clearing and cleaning of signs and marker posts.

The majority of the work will be carried out between the hours of 7.00am and 6.00pm, Monday to Saturday, but due to the type of work and excavation involved, the road will be closed 24/7 during the above dates.

The detour involves Korere-Tophouse Rd and SH63 through St Arnaud.

While we always aim to do our work with as little disruption as possible, we know that roadworks can be a hassle. We apologise in advance for any inconvenience this may cause you.

## Birds Behaving Boldly

We've all heard the childrens' verse:

The spring is sprung, the grass is riz. I wonder where the boidie is. (Unknown).

Knowing where the birds are is quite easy at the moment. Tui and korimako/bellbird make their presence very noticeable as spring brings nesting time for birds. Tui, in particular, are very vocal, and also noisy in their flight.

## Tui 'facts of life'

Tui lay eggs from September to January in a bulky, rough nest built by the female from twigs and sticks and lined with fine grasses. The nest is usually high in the canopy or subcanopy. She will lay 2-4 white or pale pink eggs, marked with reddish-brown spots and blotches. Incubation and brooding is by the female only. Chicks are initially fed only by the female, but later the male helps to feed them.

# Behaviour and ecology

Tui are notoriously aggressive, and will defend a flowering or fruiting tree, or a small part of a large tree, from all-comers, whether another tui or another bird species. They vigorously chase other birds away from their feeding territory with loud whirring wings. Tui have a display flight, in which they fly upwards above the canopy, and then make a noisy, near-vertical, dive back into the canopy. Tui play a very important role in the dynamics of New Zealand forests because they are one of the most common pollinators of flowering plants, and also disperse the seeds of trees with medium-sized fruits. (See the pollen on the head of the Tui in the photo)

#### Food

Tui diet varies depending on the seasonal availability of nectar and fruits. Their preferred diet is nectar and honeydew, and they will often shift to, or commute daily or more frequently to, good nectar sources, such as stands of puriri, kowhai, fuchsia, rewarewa, flax, rata, pohutukawa, gums and banksias. In the breeding season, tui supplement their nectar diet with large invertebrates such as cicadas and stick insects obtained by hawking or by gleaning from the outside of trees. In the autumn, medium-sized fruit such as wineberry, kaikomako, mahoe, ngaio, rimu



or kahikatea, make up much of the diet. In winter, flowering gums, banksias, puriri, and tree lucerne are important nectar sources, along with sugar-water feeders in gardens.
