

And finally, a little reminder that if you see a school bus, with the school signs up standing on the side of the road, there is a 20km/h speed limit.



We are looking for people with a positive attitude who like dealing with people in a busy and often fast-paced environment.




Accommodation in St Arnaud may be available for the summer or on a casual basis.


If you are not scared of computers and phones, enjoy talking with customers, have a good general knowledge of the local walking tracks and the area, this might be just the job for you!

Lake Rotoiti Community News

Over the last few months, "we" have been working with the Nelson/Tasman CRM team and St Arnaud Volunteer brigade to showcase the readiness activities happening in their community.



A video was produced which talks to the work being done by the community with the support of the local brigade and other stakeholders.

Located on the edge of the picturesque Nelson Lakes National Park, St Arnaud has a full-time population of around 250 residents which increases over the summer months to about 2,000 people.

The community has limited access in and out of the village with only one single lane road both ways and only the Lake Rotoiti Volunteer Fire Brigade as the sole emergency service. The brigade has identified that both the village itself as well as the surrounding area could be at risk in the event of a fire.

In 2020, the Department of Conservation, Lake Rotoiti Volunteer Fire Brigade and the local community came together to establish the Rotoiti FireSmart Working Group and were given permission to form a 'Green Firebreak' alongside an important access road to thin out the highly flammable vegetation, kanuka and manuka, remove all dead fuel, and replant with low flammability species. In addition, the brigade introduced a revised evacuation plan, along with fire safety advice and free ash buckets, and several other initiatives to reduce risk and build preparedness.

'We don't want to see this beautiful place destroyed. A firebreak is an opportunity to create a defensible space to slow a fire,' says Darren Crawford, Senior Advisor, Community Readiness and Recovery.

'The community really lead a lot of this themselves, and that's been a big part of its success'.

By using a case study like this, the Community Readiness and Recovery Directorate hopes to inspire people to think about their readiness and take action to protect themselves and their communities.



MILITARY EXERCISE

Exercise Alpha Pestilence 02 – 11 August 2023

The general public is to be advised that a New Zealand Army Exercise wil be conducted in the St Arnaud (02 – 05 Aug 23) and Rainbow Valley (06 - 11 Aug 23) areas over the period 02 – 11 August 2023.

The exercise will involve up to 55 personnel of 2nd 1st Battalion, Alpha Company from Burnham Military Camp.

Training will involve soldiers carrying weapons conducting Stability and Security Operations involving key leadership engagement, local security patrols and key point protection in St Arnaud area. The company will then move to Rainbow Valley to conduct platoon tactical operations involving blank firing and pyrotechnics.

Blank rounds and pyrotechnics will be used outside of St Arnauc Township. The exercise will also involve the movement of troops and vehicles by day and night.

The New Zealand Army takes fire risk seriously and will ensure fire mitigation is present.


