

Please be advised the Marlborough South zone, including Department of Conservation (PCL) land, will be moved to a prohibited fire season as of 0800 on Thursday 9th February 2023. All active fire permits in this zone will be suspended from that time.

The Marlborough South zone encompasses all land in the Marlborough District, including Department of Conservation land, but excluding Defence land at RNZAF Base Woodbourne, to the South of the Wairau River including the flat land from the Eastern side of State Highway 1 from Tuamarina to Rarangi.

The Marlborough North Zone will remain in a Restricted Fire Season although we will be selective when issuing fire permits.

Certain fire types are authorised to be used in a prohibited season if they meet prescribed conditions.

"NO CATCHEM"- HISTORICAL 18ft Kauri hulled vessel that once called Lake Rotoiti home.

As a steam boat enthusiast I own two historic Marlborough built Marine steam engines, a 2 ½ single built by Fairweather Engineering, Blenheim along with an 8hp compound purchased in 1970 from Charlie Perano, Picton (Whaler). It was built at the whaling station in Tory Channel by the Mother Ship Elsie's engineer (Tong). My collection includes a 1890 twin Kingscote and many steam fittings (Whistles/Oilers etc). I noticed the 18'x 5'4,

steamboat hull (No Catchem) lying derelict in Essons' Valley Picton about 1980. I owned the old Essons' Valley (1904) farmhouse and took morning runs up to the Essons' Valley reservoir. Finally, I conceded the steam boat hull was well beyond my skill set to restore. In 1984 Peter Murtons, (Nelson) a skilled traditional boat builder working in Picton had discovered the historic craft and purchased it for \$50. It turns out the carvel, kauri planked vessel was built in the Nelson area circa 1900. The steamboat now boat powered by a single cyinder car engine and had been hauled to Lake Rotoiti around 1920 by Jock Ingram on the back of a veteran International solid tired truck owned by Charlie Haggett. In 1927 this fine Kauri hulled vessel slipped through the water to win the Raglan Shield in the Rotoiti power boat annual "Round the Lake Race.

Peter Murtons re-ribbed and restored her and fitted a circa 1930 5hp Simplex (Australian engine based on a Model T piston with reversing gearbox). Peter left Picton in 1987. Returning to the South Island in 1998 he discovered the hull derelict in Koromiko. Peter acquired the boat and dutifully set out on a second rebuild and restoration, including finding and overhauling another 5hp Simplex.

No Catchem was displayed and awarded The Antique and Classic Boat of the show I attended about 20 years ago. It was the type of hull I had spent 30 years looking having earlier sighted the vessel derelict. Soon after I travelled up to Nelson and negotiated with Peter to copy the lines and an build identical steam boat hull using Kahikatea. Later I received a call offering to sell me the original No Catchem. I was delighted collected and towed the historic steam boat hull back down to Omarama after Peter fitted a new heavier shaft and new engine mounts suitable for a steam engine....I planned to fit the Blenheim Fairweather..or the twin 1890? Kingscote I own. In retrospect, I should have been content with the practical Simplex as it was a fine combination.

In 2010 I was suddenly presented with the opportunity to buy a newly build 18' hull powered by a 4hp Stewart Turner Compound that I have enjoyed steaming for the last 12 years...the hope was I could steam and restore No Catchem at the same time. Every year I was away residing in warm climates (Borneo, Japan, UK) escaping Kiwi Winters and thus losing restoration time as my Summer time was devoted to operating, maintaining and upgrading my SS Norman Rivers! However, as a positive... I have been keeping No Catchem safe in dry storage in my boat shed at Omarama with my operational SS Norman Rivers alongside for company. I have finally decided to part with this rare 1900 historical artefact... I doubt if any other 120 year old sound 18' steam boat hulls exist with carvel full length kauri planks with an Edwin Fox teak deck.
