

Te Whakarauora Whio – Friends of Rotoiti 2022 was a busy time for FOR with the additional volunteer work required on the Te Whakarauora Whio – Friends of Rotoiti project to build, deploy and check 500 double-set trap boxes on a long trap line up the Travers valley from Lake Rotoiti/

a long trap line up the Travers valley from Lake Rotoiti/ Lakehead Hut to the Upper Travers Hut, and up the Sabine valley from Sabine Hut at Lake Rotoroa to Rotomairewhenua-Blue Lake.

The purpose of this trap line is to reduce predator numbers along the rivers, giving our threatened bird species a better chance of success. The project is centred around Whio / blue duck as numbers have diminished over time so that now they are only rarely seen here. This project with the assistance of the team from the Department of Conservation at the lake, is hoping to translocate whio back into the national park in early 2024, once we have completed a full year's trapping. There is also some significant planning required to put a solid case to the DOC national Whio Recovery Group, not least being identifying a suitable source population.

At 52km long, this trap line is one of the longest in the country and we are very grateful for the local support we have received from the community, DOC and iwi along with the Rata Foundation who provided Friends of Rotoiti with the funding to see this project through.

A very special thanks to the A team and all volunteers that contributed to this project which exceeds 3000 volunteer hours.
