## **LRVFF Pigeon Valley Campaign**

The Lake Rotoiti Volunteer Fire Force committed a crew and rural tanker (5175) daily up until Day 17 of the fire when the situation finally enabled crew numbers to be reduced.

Our Little Yellow truck proved invaluable on the fire ground with its ability to go a number of places where others couldn't and attack those stubborn hot spots. It was a great experience for all of the crew as we all learnt so much about ourselves as a team and the abilities of our equipment. It was also a great opportunity to work along side a number of different crews from throughout the country, some of whom had significant big fire experience.

A big THANK YOU to The St Arnaud Rural Women and Elaine's Cafe (amongst others) for providing crew lunches early in the campaign. The Army just can't compete against the food and happy notes which made the long 15 hour days considerably more tolerable. In addition to the pigeon valley fire the members left covering the village over this period was kept busy with 7 call outs including 3 MVAs and a significant scrub fire near Murchison (which luckily was discovered by Murchison's crew on the way to one of the MVA's.). A big thanks to the community for the support we have received throughout this campaign fire. It truly helped keep us going.
